What is Honor & Collaboration

Honor is the act of recognizing and affirming the God-given value in others. It means treating people with dignity, respect, and love, not because of their position or performance, but because they bear the image of God. **Romans 12:10**

Collaboration is the practice of working together in unity toward a shared mission. It reflects humility, mutual trust, and the belief that every member of the body has something essential to contribute. **Ecclesiastes 4:9**

Why Honor & Collaboration Are Essential

- Honor creates safety and belonging.
- Collaboration fuels unity and effectiveness.
- The Kingdom advances through shared work.
- The Holy Spirit dwells where honor is present.

 1. Humility (**Philippians 2:5–8**)
 2. Teachability (**Proverbs 9:9**)
 3. Servanthood (**Mark 10:45**)
 4. Courage (**Joshua 1:9**)
 5. Emotional maturity (**Ephesians 4:2**)

Honor-Building Behaviors

- Practical Ways to Build Honor
 1. Use people's names
 2. Affirm publicly, correct privately
 3. Ask for input
 4. Show up prepared
 5. Follow through on commitments
 6. Speak well of others
- **Proverbs 18:21; Matthew 18:15**

Collaboration-Building Behaviors

- Practical Ways to Build Collaboration

1. Invite diverse voices
2. Share responsibilities
3. Communicate clearly
4. Create feedback loops
5. Celebrate team wins
